Role and responsibilities:

The Assistant Workshop Support will be key to supporting the artist run a successful workshop. They will:

- Collect Evaluation data for funders from participants
- Welcome participants to the workshop and support them in the sessions
- Make refreshments and wash up afterwards
- Buy the refreshments if needed which will be reimbursed
- Help the artist set up the room and tidy away afterwards
- Support the artist in the workshops with the creative activity
- Join in the workshop
